The story narrated by Charles Dickens second in first person, focuses on the journey of life struggle for the novel's protagonist, an orphan named Pip, with extreme imagery and colorful characters, the novel's well-received theme includes the struggle for wealth and poverty, love and rejection, and good versus evil.

This research uses the novel E-book by Charles John Huffam Dickens entitled "Great Expectations" published in (1861) as the 7th novel. The data are in the form of direct and indirect descriptions played by the main character of pip's which presents the struggle of love in pip's life which is far from perfect. Pip's Family Background

At the time, Philip was a seven-year-old orphan raised by his uncaring younger sister, Mrs. Joe, who beat him often, and his husband Joe Gargery, a blacksmith and Pip's best friend. He lives in the marshlands of Kent, England, twenty miles from the sea. Pip did not remember any of his parents, he was more than twenty years younger than his sister. Five brothers died in infancy among them: Alexander, Bartholomew, Abraham, Tobias, and Roger.

In the background of Pip's life, the author finds the fact that from all the behavior and speech that Pip's received when he was a child, it was very sad if it was experienced by a small child who was only 7 years old.

Joe looked at her in a helpless way; then took a helpless bite, and looked at me again. You know, Pip, said Joe, solemnly, with his last bite in his cheek and speaking in a confidential voice, as if we two were

quite alone, you and me is always friends, and I'd be the last to tell upon you, any time. But such a he moved his chair (Chap 2 P 15)

From the quote above, it is clear that Pip's grew up with a background in life that made him unable to grow and develop properly, because both his parents had died and there were no siblings to take care of him, finally Pip's lived with the younger sister of Pip's late father – Mrs. Joe who was always rude and had no affection for Pip's.

Pip's Love Struggle

At this point, the writer finds that Pip's first fell in love with upper class girls,

but there are differences in social levels in their lives, even though Pip's did not back down to approach the girl. Pip's an innocent boy who doesn't mind his low ranking in society. At around the age of eight, he met a beautiful but proud girl named Estella who was from the upper class. Miss Havisham was looking for a playmate for her adopted daughter Estella, and Joe's uncle, Mr. Pumblechook, recommended Pip to her, who would visit her many times.

From the findings above, estella's arrogant attitude is very clear towards pip's. but there is a different feeling inside Pip's, it's not clear yet what pip's feels whether it's falling in love at first sight or because estella is a beautiful and graceful little girl that is able to bind Pip's heart and eyes. This can be seen in the findings below, when Pip's was asked by Miss Havisham about Estella.

The writer knows that Pip's love struggle does not just stop until he admires Estella, after a long time of friends until they finally grow into teenagers and Pip falls in love with him and becomes very embarrassed by his simple background and his abusive relatives.
